Learn strategies for responding to ethical scenarios for testing situations while gleaned additional wisdom from the perspectives of participants which will impact your decision making while on the job in the real world.

Knowledge about CDI/DI and working as a team to provide support or feedback during interpreting including inferred meaning, accent, word choice, tone, affect, and comprehension. Develop skills to work as team interpreters and provide feedback to each. Identify strategies for culturally mediating ASL discourse for native English user. And discuss - culturally mediating spoken English discourse and American phone culture expectations for ASL users. Recognize and acknowledge cultural diversity such as Black ASL, genders, LBGQTIA+, age, and Deaf community. Identify and demonstrate a variety of communicative functions (persuading, complaining, arguing, negotiating, instructing, greeting, leave-taking, interrupting, etc.) in ASL conversations.
